## Home modification specification documents survey snapshot

To gather feedback on DVA's complex home modification specification documents, we invited Occupational Therapy (OT) providers to complete a survey.



The survey was sent to **208 OT providers** and to Occupational Therapy Australia



through their National

Environmental Home Modifications Special Interest Group.
A total of **43**(20.6%) responses were received.




# Usefulness of the home modification specification documents

Of the 43 survey participants, **74% found the documents to be useful.**

Are you practising in a regional, remote or metropolitan city area?



Bathroom, stairlift and ramp documents were the most commonly used. This is reflected in applications received by RAP.




### **Knowledge Gained**

Of the 43 survey participants, **60% indicated their knowledge improved regarding DVA RAP requirements.**
