If legislated the improved MRCA will provide VEA veterans (with service-related conditions) access to the MRCA Household Services program where currently VEA only veterans can only access services under the Veterans Home Care (VHC) program. The table below outlines the two program, their eligibilities, and potential services that can be accessed.
