Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide Interim Report

Recommendation 1: Government should implement legislation to **simplify and harmonise** the framework for veterans' compensation, rehabilitation and other entitlements.

- On 26 September 2022, the Government accepted Recommendation 1.
- We previously consulted on reforming legislation (late 2022) and on a proposed model to move to move from a three Act system to a **single Act system** (early 2023).
- This consultation process focuses on the draft legislation to implement the single Act model.

A Bill for an Act to amend the law relating to veterans' affairs and military rehabilitation and compensation, and for related purposes



When would the new model commence?

- It is proposed that the new model commences on 1 July 2026
- Drafting the legislation is the first step
- Following the consultation process, amendments will be made if required, before the Bill is introduced to Parliament
- This allows sufficient time to inform the veteran community on what the changes mean
- We want veterans to have time to determine whether claims should be made under the current arrangements or the new model
- It is also important to allow sufficient time to train advocates and delegates



What is the purpose of the Bill?

The Bill would implement the single Act model proposed in the Veterans' Legislation Reform Consultation Pathway, shaped by the feedback provided in 2023

The core elements are:

- all new claims for compensation and rehabilitation will be considered under an improved MRCA
- closing the VEA and DRCA to most new compensation related claims
- VEA and DRCA compensation payments being received at the commencement date would be grandparented



MRCA Improvements

There are a number of improvements to the MRCA:

- introduction of the Additional Disablement Amount to the MRCA, similar to the VEA's Extreme Disablement Adjustment
- higher travel reimbursement amount when using a private vehicle to travel for treatment
- coverage for medical event while on duty
- accept claims for certain specified conditions on a presumptive basis under the MRCA
- date of effect for permanent impairment payments
- merging the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission with the Repatriation Commission
- posthumous conversion of permanent impairment periodic payments

Current VEA Veterans and Families

- Incapacity compensation payments.
- Partners of deceased veterans whose death is due to service would have choice to receive compensation as an aged-based lump sum and receive increased compensation.
- Increased funeral allowance of \$3,000 for previous automatic grant categories under the VEA.
- Reimbursement for funeral expenses of up to \$14,062 for all service related deaths.
- Uniform provisions for household and attendant care.
- Cessation date for Disability Compensation Payment to date of death.



Current DRCA Veterans and Families

- Special Rate Disability Pension
- Gold Cards
- Education Scheme
- Single Review Pathway

Schedules of the Bill

1	Single ongoing Act main
	amendments

Gives effect to the key Bill objective – to simplify and harmonise the legislation through adapting the MRCA as the single ongoing Act

Closes VEA and DRCA to new liability & compensation claims from 1 July 2026

Opens the MRCA to claims arising from service prior to 1 July 2004

Standardises various provisions which had operated differently across the three Acts. For eg a standard approach for rehabilitation, irrespective of when a veteran served

2 Single ongoing Act enhancements

This would enhance the MRCA. It would provide a single set of eligibility provisions for various entitlements

Introduces a presumptive liability mechanism and a new Additional Disablement Amount



Schedules of the Bill

3	Review Pathway	Standardises the review pathway for compensation decisions across the 3 Acts Part 1 would commence 60 days after Royal Assent (prior to remaining single ongoing Act reforms)
		Part 2 would commence on 1 July 2026
4	Merging Commissions	Consolidate the powers and functions of the Repatriation Commission and the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission
		The Repatriation Commission would continue in existence
5	Repatriation Medical Authority and Specialist Medical Review Council	Transfer the provisions governing the RMA and SMRC into the MRCA. There would be no change to the functions or powers of either body



Schedules of the Bill

6	Disability compensation cessation date	Alters the final date of payment of disability compensation payment under the VEA Currently, when a veteran in receipt of disability compensation payment dies, the payment and associated allowances are retroactively ceased at the end of the fortnight pay period preceding the date of death This would harmonise the cessation date for disability compensation payment and associated allowances with the cessation date of comparable payments. The cessation date would be extended to the veteran's date of death
7	Application and transitional provisions	Deals with interaction between the law as it currently stands, and the law as it will be once the reforms commence. For eg. how to handle claims which may be undetermined on the day of commencement
8	Consequential amendments	Deals with changes which need to be made to other Acts as a result of the reforms being made to veteran's legislation
