# **VCES Eligibility - Professional Assessment**

The Repatriation Commission has made a Determination under section 116A(1) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* which authorises the Commission to determine a class of persons, a member of which is an "eligible child of a veteran" for the purposes of eligibility for benefits under the *Veterans' Children Education Scheme.* 

This stems from a range of government initiatives in response to a study into the health of Australia's Vietnam veteran community. The study found that suicides were more prevalent in Vietnam veterans' children than the Australian community standard.

The purpose of this determination is to give Vietnam veterans' children or former children, who are diagnosed with a depressive disorder or are regarded as vulnerable, eligibility for the benefits, support and guidance available through the Veterans' Children Education Scheme.

## Criteria

The Repatriation Commission has issued a Determination through which this person may be eligible for benefits under the Veterans' Children Education Scheme if he/she:

- is diagnosed by an appropriately qualified professional as having a depressive disorder;
  OR
- in the opinion of an appropriately qualified professional, is vulnerable.

An appropriately qualified professional means a person who is:

- · a medical practitioner (general practitioner or specialist); or
- a psychologist who has full registration as a psychologist in the State or Territory in which they practice; or
- a social worker who has completed a 4 year recognised degree and has eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers.
